# 2024 Annual Report

MAF foundation was registered as a charity in 2013. The Foundation started receiving donations in 2014.

**Total donations:** \$668,443.78 (In 2024 there were 102 donors and \$71,903.38 in donations.)

**Total Grants Approved:** \$202,050.00 (This includes Covid grants)

**Total Youth in Philanthropy grants:** \$14,860.00

Freedom Concepts, a local Manitoba manufacturer of adapted equipment built a DCR16 Tricycle (with a frog animal horn attached) to enable a six year old with Autism Spectrum Disorder to ride a bike. A young boy at the Morris school now has use of the tricycle. The total tricycle cost was \$4,177.50 and MAF contributed a \$2,100 grant to Children's Rehabilitation




## Morris Garden Project

"The community garden is an off shoot of the Red River Valley Food Bank" said spokesperson and garden owner herself Claudia Schmidt. "The Morris United Church allows us to use their space free and provides water for the gardens from an underground line and hose setup."

"The aim was to have growers augment their income and actually produce some of their own food. The original 'Wonder Garden' beds were made of wood and rotted away. More durable 'Community Garden' metal beds were purchased with a grant from the Morris Area Foundation. We are so grateful for the help we receive from the community and especially the MAF."

"One year an intrepid (and adventurous) gardener decides more beauty and less bounty. They planted mostly sunflowers with some wild flowers and no vegetables. The flower garden was beautiful and attracted birds and insects to the benefit of the vegetable growers. To satisfy all, gardeners are asked to plant Marigolds (one row only) to ward off deer."
